

## USING CANVA FOR JIGSAW READING ACTIVITY

**Lesson Title:** English 10 - Unit 5, Reading: The Association of Southeast Asian Nations

**Lesson Objectives:** By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

- read for the main idea of paragraphs about the ASEAN
- read for specific information about the ASEAN
- remember some information about the ASEAN

### **Activity Description:**

*Objective:* Students will be able to read for specific information about one aspect of the ASEAN and demonstrate using an infographic

*Summary of previous activities:* This activity is conducted after students have learned some vocabulary about the ASEAN and matched the heading with the paragraphs about ASEAN.

*Procedure:*

- Ss are divided into 5 groups and each group is provided with a Canva link. On the Canva link, each group has to read a paragraph about one aspect of the ASEAN and choose the most important details to illustrate.

- Group 5: Cultural and sport activities

- Teacher shows some samples of a mini-infographic and some features of Canva that students can use.
- Students work together and design a mini-infographic using the information from the assigned paragraph. Students work in 7 minutes.
- After 7 minutes, each group takes turns to briefly introduce their infographic. Each group has 1-2 minutes to present.
- After each presentation, teacher asks the whole class some comprehension questions. Students answer by typing into the chat box.

#### **Comprehension questions:**

- Group 1: History and membership
  - Which were the first five members of ASEAN?
  - When did Brunei Darussalam join the bloc?
  - When did Vietnam join the bloc?
  - When did other states join the bloc?
- Group 2: Area, population and economies
  - How big is ASEAN?
  - What are the six majors?
- Group 3: Aims and motto
  - What is the ASEAN's motto?
- Group 4: Charter
  - What are the main principles of the ASEAN Charter?
  - When did the charter come into force?
- Group 5: Cultural and sport activities
  - How does the bloc integrate in member states?
  - What are some sport activities organized by the ASEAN?

## Samples of educational infographics:

### The Lowdown On Climate Change

Climate change is a serious global issue. Here are some eye-opening statistics everyone needs to know.

**416 parts per million**  
This is the concentration of carbon dioxide found in our atmosphere as of May 2020. It is the highest it has been in human history.

**2010s = warmest decade**  
The average global temperatures in 2019 were 1.8°F (0.98°C) warmer than the 20th century average. According to NOAA, it marks the end of the warmest decade on record.

**11% of emissions**  
Eleven percent of all global greenhouse gas emissions were caused by deforestation.

**It all lies in nature**  
Nature-based solutions are found to be most effective in fighting against climate change, but they only receive 3% of all climate funding.

**It's time to take action**  
Take action by educating yourself and urging your community to get involved in addressing environmental concerns.

**General Theory of Relativity**  
Grounded in the mathematical concepts of differential geometry and tensor calculus, Einstein conceptualized the groundbreaking General Theory of Relativity, which posits that time and space are two aspects of spacetime.

**Theory of Special Relativity**  
Einstein's most famous theory explains motion between different places that move at constant speeds relative to each other.

**Einstein Field Equations**  
These equations use geometry to represent gravity's effects. They are also referred to as the Einstein-Hilbert Equations.
